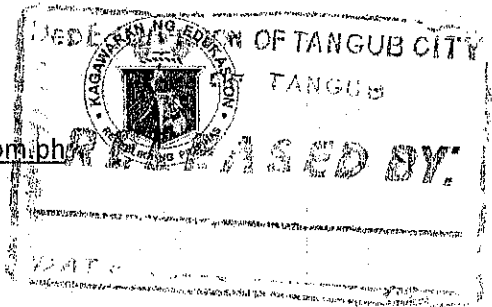

Subject: Enhancement Training for Qualifiers to the 2016 Regional Schools Press Conference (RSPC)

1. This office will conduct a ten – day Enhancement Training for Qualifiers to the 2016 Regional Schools Press Conference (RSPC) on the following scheduled dates at Tangub City Division Conference Hall, Division of Tangub City, Tangub City.

Dates:	English and Filipino, Elementary and Secondary
August 19 – 20, 2016 -----	News Writing, Sports Writing and Collaborative Writing
September 2 – 3, 2016 -----	Editorial Writing, Editorial Cartooning and Collaborative Writing
September 9 – 10, 2016 -----	Feature Writing, Science and Health/Technology and Collaborative Writing
September 16 – 17, 2016 -----	Copy Reading and Headline Writing, Collaborative Writing and Photojournalism
October 7 – 8, 2016 -----	All Journalistic Events

2. The training is intended to enhance the journalistic skills of DSPC winners to compete in the Regional Level to be held on the 2nd week of October, 2016 as scheduled tentatively at Malaybalay City Division of Malaybalay City. Further, the training aims to achieve the following objectives:
 - a. To upgrade the knowledge of participants on campus journalism particularly on content guidelines in the various events;
 - b. To provide insights on their role as journalists in upholding good governance, leadership and transparency; and
 - c. To develop the skills of journalists in their respective events for better performance in the Regional Level competition.
3. Participants to this training are all school paper advisers/coaches and journalists in both elementary and secondary levels who are RSPC qualifiers.
4. Travelling and other expenses incurred by the participants shall be charged against local School Publication Funds, PTCA Funds and school's Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses (MOOE) subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
5. Considering the importance of this academic enhancement training, 100% support from all School Principals and School Head Teachers concern are expected.
